DESCRIBE THE SOURCE, GIVING QUOTES OR EVIDENCE.

CONTENT:

WHAT DOES THE SOURCE INFER ABOUT THE TOPIC OF STUDY? WHAT IS THE SOURCE TRYING TO TELL THE READER? DOES IT LINK TO YOUR OWN KNOWLEDGE ABOUT THE TOPIC?

PURPOSE:

WHAT IS THE MOTIVE OF THE SOURCE? IS THIS SOURCE TRYING TO ...

- PERSUADE?
- INFORM?
- EDUCATE?
- RECORD?
- ENTERTAIN?

LIMITATIONS:

WHAT DOES THE SOURCE NOT TELL US/INFER ABOUT THE TOPIC OF STUDY? WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE TOPIC THAT THE SOURCE DOES NOT REVEAL? DOES THE **PROVENANCE** MEAN THAT THERE IS ANY POTENTIAL **BIAS?** IS THE SOURCE SUBJECTIVE OR OBJECTIVE?

VALUE:

HOW USEFUL IS THIS SOURCE? DOES THE SOURCE SUPPORT YOUR OWN KNOWLEDGE? DOES THE PROVENANCE AND CONTENT MAKE IT USEFUL?

DO THE LIMITATIONS REDUCE THE VALUE OF THE SOURCE?
